<u>Skara Brae</u>	<u>Stonehenge</u>	<u>Jobs</u>
Where is Skara Brae? Why is it still an important place? Look at the website and write about what you could see if you visited it.	Research Stonehenge and record some facts about it. Draw a sketch of it. Why is it still so important now?	What type of jobs did people have in the Stone Age? Remember they usually lived in settlements and needed to provide for their community.
<u>Britain</u>	<u>Play</u>	<u>Food</u>
Where did people live in Britain during the Stone Age? You could mark the areas on a map of Britain and label them.	Did the children living during the Stone Age play any games? What did they play with and what was it made from?	What did the people who lived during the Stone Age eat? Use your research skills to put together a list of what a meal might consist of.
<u>Living then</u>	<u>Stonehenge</u>	<u>Art</u>
Can you write a diary imagining you are alive during the Stone Age? What would you do in a typical day?	Research Stonehenge and record some facts about it. Draw a sketch of it. Why is it still so important now?	Can you produce some Stone Age art? Think art in the style of cave paintings.

As scientists we will be studying rocks and fossils.

As writers we will be studying the text Stone Age Boy and imagining we are alive in the Stone Age.

As mathematicians we will be learning about addition and subtraction.

As historians we will be learning about The Stone Age and will visit Bishops Wood to learn about the developments of the period.

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As artists we are making clay pinch pots.

Using our computing skills we will be creating a presentation showing moving animations.

In music 3S will be learning the ukulele on Fridays and 3B will be exploring playing skills using a virtual glockenspiel.

In PSHE we will be learning about being ourselves. How we are unique and how important it is to be proud of our achievements.
